Write the comparative adjective forms of all the adjectives on the next page.

Check your answers as a class.

Test each other on those forms.

Play the same asking yes/ no questions game again, but this time without the next page to help, and with one point for "I don't know" or "I'm not sure" answers but no points for "Yes" or "No" answers.
