- Do you know where the restroom/ night market/ nearest bank/ taxi rank/...is?
- Do you live near here?
- Do you need any recommendations for restaurants/ foods to try/ hawkers to try/ things to see/ things to do/ nightlife/... (while you are here)?
- Have you been watching Game of Thrones/ the Champions League/...?
- Have you come far (today)?
- Have you ever been to ...?/ Have you ever visited ...?
- Have you ever read/ seen...?
- Have you had a chance to visit.../ try.../ see.../ meet.../... (yet)?
- Have you tried... (food)?
- I guess it's (a bit/ much)... er/ much more... (than this) (back) where you come from (now).

- You can leave your coat/ bag/ stuff/... here/ over there/... (if you like).

Discussing business cards yes/ no questions

• Do you have a business card (on you)?/ Perhaps we should exchange business cards.

Moving to another place/ Directing people/ Giving directions/ Leading people somewhere yes/ no questions

- Shall we make a move?
- Shall I take you to...?
- Shall I walk you to the elevator?
- Can you remember the way out?
- Are you okay getting back to your hotel?
- Shall I call you a taxi?
- Do you need a ride to the station?
- Would you like me to take you to the airport?

Introducing other people yes/ no questions

- Have you met...?
- Have you two met?
- You probably know (my colleague)...

Small talk at the end of a conversation yes/ no questions

- Are you finished/ Have you finished (for the day/ for the day/ for the week)?
- Do you have (m)any more meetings (today)?
- Do you have to go straight back to your office?
- Do you have any plans for this evening?
- Do you have any plans for the weekend?

Ask about any questions above that you don't understand, couldn't answer, etc, working together to answer them each time.
