

Silent Letters and Rhyming Words Activities

Read the poem below and do the activity or activities below that your teacher says:

- Work together to read through the poem below, making sure that the two lines which are together rhyme, e.g. that line three rhymes with line four. One person should say just line one, then the next person should say lines two and three, then the next person lines four and five, etc, so the two rhyming words are said by different people.
- Listen as your partner reads out the first ten lines of the poem and correct them if any
 of the pairs of lines don't rhyme. They will then do the same as you read the next ten
 lines.
- Listen as your partner reads out the poem with silent letters wrongly pronounced, then correct them on their deliberate mistakes.
- Listen as your partner reads out the poem, underline any letters in the final words of the lines which they don't pronounce, then discuss which letters you underlined and if there are any other silent letters.
- Work together to underline the silent letters in the final words of the lines below, using the rhymes with the matching words to help. There is one silent letter in each pair of lines.

Look at lists of silent letters online, try to think of rhyming words, then do one of these activities:

- Challenge another group to think of rhyming words for words with silent letters
- Read out the word with a silent letter and the word you thought of, and see if the other group agree that they rhyme
- Read out the word and rhyming word and see if the other group can identify the silent letter
